### **You will be responsible for:**

Leading the online and in-person delivery and assessment of a range of modules for our degree programmes, creating and adapting content to ensure it is up to date and fit for purpose. Facilitate other industry professionals to support you and coordinate with support lecturers and our apprenticeship skills coaches to ensure that the curriculum meets the apprentices' needs. Support apprentices through their 3-year journey to successful completion.

As part of the wider teaching team at Ada, you will collaborate with your peers (including our 6th form staff) and team members, giving and receiving feedback, planning ahead and supporting each other to ensure an ever-improving experience for our apprentices and a culture of continued professional development for all staff members.

## **Your main responsibilities are:**

- Lecturing across specified modules aligned to your experience and expertise
- Leading the delivery of engaging course material to apprentices and ensure their educational progress
- Updating and creating new learning content for existing lectures and workshops preferably applying it to real world scenarios
- Creating and marking assignments and exams
- Providing feedback to apprentices on their progress and additional support where necessary
- Working collaboratively with the teaching team to ensure that individualised support programmes are in place for learners such as those with Special Educational Needs
- Supporting the programme management team with reviewing work-based evidence
- Actively participate in team-led initiatives.
